

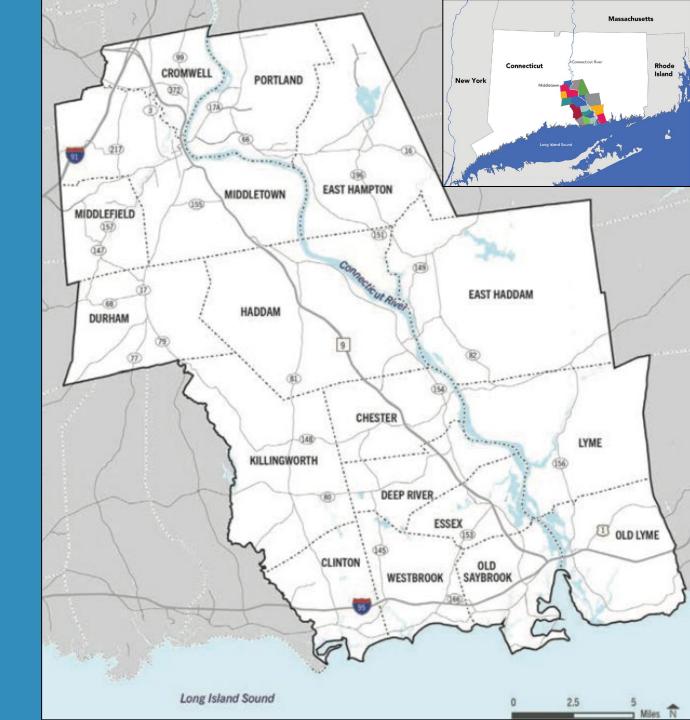




# Project Overview & Update

# Safe Streets & Roads for All (SS4A)

Provides grants to local, regional, and Tribal communities for implementation, planning, and demonstration activities as part of a systematic approach **to prevent deaths and serious injuries** on the nation's roadways





## Vision and Goals

#### **Action Plan Vision**

#### RiverCOG will

- Aim to eliminate fatalities and serious injuries on regional roadways by 2045
- Encourage all municipalities and transportation agencies within the region to align their safety initiatives with Vision Zero
- Position municipalities with identified projects for SS4A funding and other funding sources
- Apply a Safe System Approach
- Reassess crash data every five years



# Comprehensive Safety Action Plan

#### **Actions**

Safe Design (infrastructure improvements e.g., curb extensions, high-vis crosswalks)

**Policies and Practices** (e.g. Complete Streets policy)


Education, Resources, and Enforcement (e.g. speed reductions, driver campaigns)

**Data Monitoring** 

#### **Focus Corridors**

Reviewed crash themes for Action Plan implementation focus

Identified location-specific improvements for top 10 locations across 10 municipalities



#### Cromwell

#### Review of Cromwell's crash history (2019-2023):

- 9 serious injury crashes
- Corridors of Concern
  - Route 3 (Shunpike Road)
  - Route 99 at Route 9
  - Route 372 (Berlin Road)

# Safe Design

#### A focus on design and implementation for:

- Visibility
- Access management issues
- Lighting
- Bike and pedestrian network gaps

# **Draft Planning-level Concepts**

- <u>Draft</u> planning-level concepts
- Further iterations of design will be needed.
- These will assist with grant applications.
